- How do I schedule Masses for relatives / friends?
- When would the next openings be?
- What is the donation amount?

Just mail in or drop your request in the collection with "Masses" indicated on the envelope. Write a note as to when you'd like to have the Masses prayed, the names, and if it is an anniversary of a death, you can indicate that and it will be noted.

Please remember, Sundays are always reserved for "Parishioners Needs" as required by the Diocese. Monday's are Father's only day off, there is a Communion Service. Requested Masses are rotated to be fair to all.

If you have just one request, for example, a "date of death anniversary", it is listed on that requested date, if possible. If you request several Masses, the Masses will be rotated with the rest of the already listed/requested Masses by other parishioners.

If your requested date lands on a Monday or Sunday, then the Mass request is designated as close to that date as possible. If you have a particular day of the week you can attend Mass, let the Secretary know.

The Diocese suggests a \$10 per Mass donation. The parish will work with parishioners, if needed.

The Catholic Answer Book

Q: What do we mean in the Apostles' Creed by saying that Jesus "descended into hell"?

A. This is a reference to the verse in the First Epistle of Peter which tells us that between His death and resurrection, our Lord "went to preach to the spirits in prison" (3:19). The traditional explanation of this passage is that Jesus went to the just souls (in hades, the underworld, sheol, limbo, or the hell of the just—all synonyms) who had lived under the Old Covenant and had died without hearing the Gospel preached. Jesus then shared with them the good news of salvation and thus offered them the opportunity to avail themselves of this salvation.
