Spend some quiet time with the Lord

Jesus is truly God and truly human. In the earliest centuries, people had a hard time believing he was God. In more recent centuries, we have a hard time believing he is human. We see his humanity in its stark reality. Jesus is looking at death—not any death, but a shameful painful death on the cross and he looks it in the eye. He is on the ground pouring his heart out, “troubled and distressed”. In the end he will manage to see it through, but he struggled, and Mark wants us to know that. He paints his portrait of Jesus with the colors of human weakness and helplessness. For some reason, there are sufferings that, even with God’s help, can’t be avoided. We’ve all been through a few, or a lot, and there will be more along the way. Jesus also experienced this kind of suffering firsthand, and he is with us through them all, including the ones I may face today.

CATHOLIC RELIEF SERVICES

Helping our Brothers & Sisters in Japan

All you need do is pick up the newspaper or watch the news to see the extent of the devastation inflicted on areas of Japan following a massive 8.9 magnitude earthquake and 33-foot tsunami. Houses have been swept away by water, buildings have collapsed, and thousands are wounded, missing, or dead.

Catholic Relief Services (CRS), the international relief and development agency of the American Catholic Church, has been working with her sister agency, Caritas Japan, to provide for the growing humanitarian needs of those impacted by this disaster.

Rather than taking up a second collection at this time, I am urging parishes throughout the Diocese of Boise to strongly support and promote the diocesan collection for Catholic Relief Services already scheduled for the week-end of April 2-3rd. Since this is the agency designated by the American Bishops for international disaster relief, monies raised will be used to support the ongoing emergency relief efforts in Japan as well provide assistance to other impoverished and disadvantaged people throughout the world.
