## SUMMERTIME INFO (from the “Catholic Source Book”)

### “He Descended Into Hell”

In the Creed when we say Christ “descended into hell,” we mean “hades, “ or “shoel” (the place of the dead) not “gehenna” the place of the damned—the hell of punishment). Jesus Christ experienced death completely, going into the “underworld” and “bursting the bonds of hell (limbo),” thereby showing power and authority over all creation, including death, and releasing the souls of the just who were awaiting salvation through his death and resurrection.

### Good Manners and Self-Defense

In the Middle Ages there were those who taught that he devil entered a person through the mouth, at the time of a yawn. So naturally, when you yawn, you cover your mouth, or make the sign of the cross over it.

### St. Anthony and the Child Jesus

Once as a guest in someone's home, Anthony was seen through an open window, deep in meditation and communion. He was holding Christ so single-mindedly in his heart that the Christ Child was seen in his arms. Images of Anthony with the child Jesus, the only person other than Mary, Joseph, and Simeon so privileged, are common in church windows and statuary.
