Assessment of SPP School's Catholic Identity
This school is Catholic, approved by the Local Ordinary (Canon 803), provides authentic Catholic teaching, opportunities for community worship and participation in the sacraments, and promotes evangelization and service to the community.

At Saints Peter and Paul School the core text of our religious instruction is Blest Are We by RCL Benziger Publishers. This text, approved by the Diocese of Boise, develops faith through a spiral curriculum based on the four pillars of the Catechism of the Catholic Church. These four pillars of Catholic doctrine are **What Catholics Believe, How Catholics Worship, How Catholics Live, and How Catholics Pray**. The four pillars are taught in every unit, at every level, every year.

All classroom teachers are either certified by the Diocese of Boise, or are on schedule to receive certification in May 2011. All classroom teachers receive ten hours of faith formation annually to renew certification. We currently have the opportunity to complete this requirement at our annual diocesan conference, through parish adult education opportunities, and in school staff retreats.

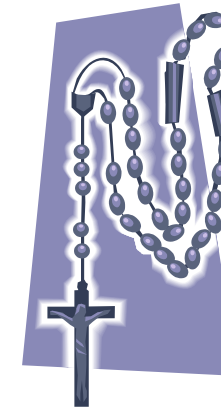

Feast of All Saints ... (Catholic Customs & Traditions)
The Feast of All Saints, still a holy day on **November 1**, a began in early centuries as a “catchall,” remembering martyrs whose names were not known and who therefore did not have their own festivities. It was introduced in Rome on May 13, 610, as the “Feast of All Holy Martyrs” by Pope Boniface IV. The occasion was a gift of the ancient pagan temple of the Pantheon to the church by the Roman Emperor, Phocas. First celebrated on May 13, it was transferred to November 1 for the universal church by Pope Gregory IV in 835. By then it included all the saints. The reason for the new date may have been a practical one. It seems that so many pilgrims came to Rome for the feast that it was moved to the fall when more food would be available for the harvest. The new date spread throughout the church. Its eve, All Hallows Eve or Halloween, gave its name to a pagan Celtic Druid custom still popularly observed on October 31.
