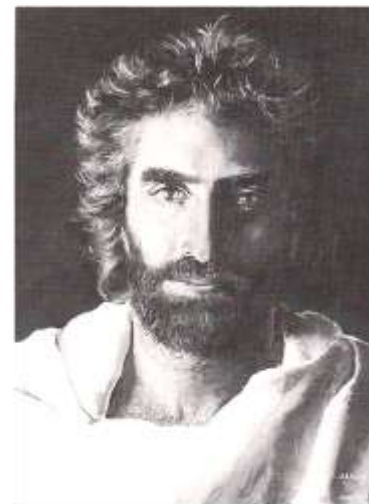

The Pilgrimage of the Way of the Cross

A Christian’s faith never required pilgrimage to Jerusalem as a Moslem’s did to Mecca (commemorating Muhammad’s hegira, or “flight”). However, the Holy Places have been transported to church walls throughout the Catholic world in the form of the Stations of the Cross. Although the *Stabat Mater* and Good Friday’s “*We adore thee, O Christ...*” have become traditional, the devotion itself only requires the movement from one station to the next. The stations themselves, despite the elaborate depictions that have evolved, are mere wooden crosses.

Tradition says Mary daily retraced the via dolorosa; however, it was only in the middle Ages that devotion to Christ’s passion flourished. The early Christians’ focus was on the risen Christ. The medieval mind, however, captivated by Christ’s suffering humanity, sought to tread his very steps. Those with time and money could; others had the Holy Land brought to them, in the form of “stations,” reproductions of the Holy Places in their own place.

The Franciscans, receiving custody of the Holy Places in 1343, stirred an interest in the passion among the faithful. The Franciscan St. Leonard of Port Maurice, the “preacher of the Way of the Cross,” spread the devotion in the eighteenth century, making it possible even for non-Franciscan churches to have the stations (previously not allowed). From the beginning, there have been more and less than fourteen. In 1975, Pope Paul VI approved a new set of stations which includes a fifteenth, the Resurrection.
