## The Proud Lily

There is much lily lore. It would be enough for it to be a spring flower, representing life’s renewal and the spirit’s rebirth. But there is more. According to legend, the lily lost its self-respect on the night of Christ’s agony in the garden: the other flowers bowed their heads in sorrow in Christ’s presence, but not the lily. How could it, being the most fragrant and beautiful flower in the Garden (according to its own estimation)? Upon Christ’s display of humility, however, the lily belatedly hung its head in shame, and has humbly remained so ever since. ( As a matter of fact, our Easter lily is not native to Palestine, but was imported in the 1880’s from Bermuda. “Croft’s Lily” is grown mainly in the Pacific Northwest and California.)

## Your Questions ~ God’s Answers

(...Peter Kreeft )

### What difference does Jesus make to my life?

There is only one person in the world who can answer that question. It is not me, or your parents, or your priest, or even the Pope. It is the person who is reading these words right now.

The difference Jesus can make to your life, if you let him, and the difference he wants to make, is the difference between being alone and being with God, the difference between trying to play God with your life (and, of course, failing) and letting God be God in your life. It is the difference between despair and hope, the difference between having and not having “a reason to live and a reason to die”, the difference between having an ultimate meaning to your life and just letting things drift along and push you around like a leaf on the wind.

Jesus existed long before you were born. “In the beginning was the Word, and the Word was with God, and the Word was God. He was in the beginning with God” (Jn 1:1-2). He said, “Before Abraham was born, I AM” (Jn 8:58) Jesus designed you before you were born; he is the author of your true identity (Ps 139:15-15). Without him you cannot succeed in your life’s most important task, knowing who you are and becoming yourself.

Everyone in life has two jobs. Their second jobs vary: mother, ditch digger, president, nurse, auto mechanic, lawyer, shoelace manufacturer, or whatever. Every one of those jobs is replaceable, and, when you die, someone else will do your job in your place. But no one else can ever take your place at your first and most important job in life: being yourself. Only you can do it.

Just as you are unique, one of a kind, Jesus is unique, one of a kind. Jesus is not one of the many alternatives, but the only Savior. He is not for some people and not for others, “for there is one God, and there is one who brings God and mankind together, the man Christ Jesus” (1 Tim 2:5). He is the one bridge from Heaven to earth and from earth to Heaven. “I am the way, the truth, and the life. No one can come to the Father except through me: (Jn 6:14). He brings God into your life and he brings you to God. That’s the infinite difference he makes...if you let him.
