





## If God loves me so much, why do bad things happen to me?

A man named Job asked the same question after suffering total disaster—he lost all his children and property and got a terrible disease. Three of his best friends offered explanations that seemed much too simple for Job. You can read their famous dialogue in chapters 2 through 37 in the Book of Job. Read the Lord's unsettling response to one of the life's toughest question (Job 38:1-42.6

But the Bible has even more to say about sin and evil. There really is such a thing. This may be an unpopular teaching of Christianity, but it is also one of the most realistic. Read what the Bible has to say about the reality of evil and its impact on the world: Psalm 51:1-17; 1 Corinthians 15:21-22; Galatians 5:19-26.

Bad things happen to us not because God does not love us but because of all the evil in the world: and *that* came from human sin, not from God (Gen 3.) Consider the following points:

- 1. To deal with evil, God sent his own Son Jesus in to the middle of the worst evil in the world, crucifixion. Suffering comes with being a Christian—it's normal for the Christian (Heb 11:32-12:11; 1 Peter 4:12-16) Like a training exercise that makes our bodies strong, suffering helps to make our faith and character strong.
- **2.** Suffering is temporary, even if it lasts a lifetime on earth. Sometimes you see a light at the end of the tunnel only to find out that it's part of a fast-approaching freight train. But don't worry. You will eventually get to the end of the tunnel. (Read Rom 8:18-23, 35-39; 1 Pet 5:8-11.)
- **3.** God can produce good things out of bad situations (Rom 5;3-5; James 1:2-4). He has an amazing ability to transform the results of a bad situation, because although he allows evil, he also rules over it.

Saint Philip Neri said, "The cross is the gift God gives to his friends." When we suffer, we help Jesus carry his Cross. We share in his work. Saint Paul said in Colossians 1:24: "Now I rejoice in my sufferings for your sake, and in my flesh I complete what is lacking in Christ's afflictions for the sake of his body, that is, the church." This is a great mystery, and a wonderful one. It makes even suffering meaningful and full of hope.
