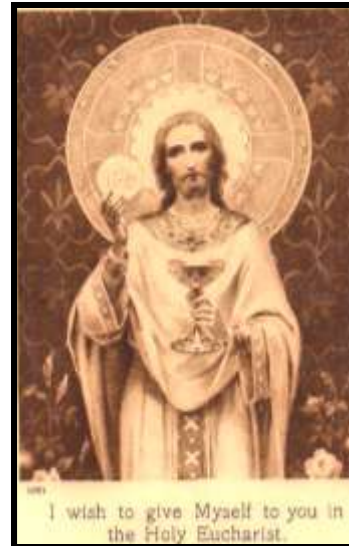

### Corpus Christi Sunday

Commemorating the Last Supper, Holy Thursday is the "Eucharistic Feast." In its liturgical setting, however, it could not bear the devotional practices that piety required in its love for the Body of Christ, nor could it adequately allow for the joy that wanted expression, given the sorrowful mysteries of Holy Thursday and Good Friday. Hence, there was a movement that began in twelfth-century Belgium for a special feast to honor the Blessed Sacrament. It was Pope Urban IV who first established the feast, and, most notable, commissioned the great Dominican scholar, Thomas Aquinas, to compose liturgical tests for it.



#### Eucharistic Processions

This was an early element in Corpus Christi devotions, emphasizing Christ's real Eucharistic presence. The Blessed Sacrament was carried through the town after Mass on its feast day (beneath its festive "ombrellino," or canopy). These processions came to include a version of the Roman "stations" : stops at various points and, with Eucharist exposed on a simple altar, a sung Gospel passage, a hymn, harvest blessing, and benediction.

#### The Infiorata

"Carpet of Flowers" is a monastic tradition hundreds of years old, honoring the Blessed Sacrament. There was custom of strewing flowers in the path of the Eucharistic procession on the feast of Corpus Christi. From this practice evolved the art of designing panels made with flowers depicting religious themes and scenes for use on Corpus Christi.

#### Visit to the Blessed Sacrament

This has taken various forms, depending upon culture, era, and personal preference. It acknowledges the present of Christ in the Holy Eucharist ("real presence") outside of Mass ("abiding presence"). The genuflection (or a deep bow, common in the Eastern Church) is a traditional gesture of respect, as is a bow or tip of the hat while passing a church.

#### Forty Hours' Adoration

This devotion of the Blessed Sacrament commemorates the forty hours Jesus was entombed. It originated at Milan in 1534 and was propagated by the Jesuits under St. Ignatius. It spread to many countries by the end of the eighteenth century. St. John Neumann (1811-60) is credited with it in the U.S. Where it is more feasible, the forty hours are interrupted for the night and extended over three days: The first and third days include liturgies of the Blessed Sacrament; the second day, a liturgy for peace; the solemn closing of Forty Hours included the Litany of the Saints with procession and benediction of the Blessed Sacrament.

### The Painting in the Vestibule?

Have you stopped and really looked at the large painting on the East wall of the vestibule? What do you think it is portraying?

This painting is by Andrei Rublev, a Russian artist whose icon of three angels sitting at Abraham's table has been called the **Old Testament Trinity**. What can be illuminating in this image is what it communicates of relationship, of openness, of interconnection and intercommunion, of individuality and mutuality—in a word, a love that binds and frees among the figures, that draws in and radiates out at one and the same time. This is the Trinity of Persons into whom we were plunged at baptism; this is the mystery of divine life which fills us and joins us together and sends us to be God's presence and activity in the world.
