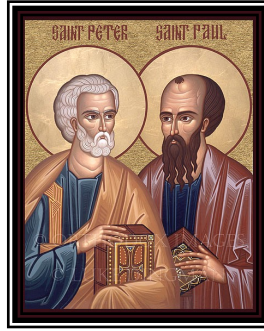

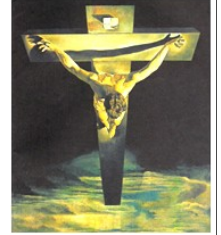

Our Mass



1. What is the Mass?

The Mass is the un-bloody sacrifice of the body and blood of Christ.

2. In what sense is the Sacrifice of the Mass the same as that of Calvary?

In the Sacrifice of the Mass and in that of the cross we have the same High Priest who offers the sacrifice, and the same Victim who is immolated: who is, Christ Jesus our Lord. The priest who says the Mass is only the minister and representative of Christ, the High Priest.

a.. **The Mass a Continual Sacrifice.** The prophet Malachy foretold the Sacrifice of the Mass when he said: "From the rising of the sun even to the going down, My name is great among the Gentiles, and in every place there is sacrifice, and there is offered to My name a clean oblation" (Mal. 1: 11) There is no moment of the day or night in which the Mass is not being said in some part of the world.

3. When was the Sacrifice of the Mass instituted?

The Sacrifice of the Mass was instituted at the Last Supper.

4. The four ends for which the Mass is offered.

- As a sacrifice of praise and adoration to God;
- As a sacrifice of thanksgiving for all graces and favors received;
- As a sacrifice of propitiation to atone for our sins
- As a sacrifice of petition to obtain all graces and blessings.

5. To whom is the Sacrifice of the Mass offered?

The Sacrifice of the Mass is offered to God alone.

6. When is the Mass offered?

Mass is offered on every day of the year except Good Friday.

7. Serving Mass: Servers are allowed the great privilege of serving Mass, and every genuinely Catholic young person should be glad to take advantage of it. The server mingles with the angels in the sanctuary, and they receive special graces for assisting the priest. It is best to begin to serve when they are young and they should be proud to serve all through their high school course. They should be modest in demeanor and not gaze about; and above all they must be prompt and regular.
