Votive and Vigil Lights

Two kinds of burning lights, which are so evident in most Catholic churches and shrines, do not seem to be part of a light vs. dark symbolism. Votive lights (from the Latin votum, "vow") and vigil lights (from the Latin vigilia, "waiting" or "watching") are symbolic of two purposes of prayer.
