**History of Sts. Peter & Paul Church**

**A Missionary Era**

From 1883 to 1892, Jesuit fathers Alexander Diomedi, Fr. Aloysius Soer and Fr. A. Morvillo served the area of Keuterville, Cottonwood, Mount Idaho, Grangeville, and the Salmon Rover mines.

According to the archives of St. Gertrude's Monastery, a church was built at Grangeville in 1886 which burned in 1893. No other source substantiates this statement.

Mount Idaho was only four miles from Grangeville and the priest seems to have administered the two places together. In Mount Idaho the first services were held in someone's home and usually 15 or 20 people would be present. Mrs. L.P. Brown later recalled hearing Father Soer tell how he prayed that he might not get lost (and did get lost), had nothing with him but a sandwich to eat, yet pulled the saddle off his horse and slept soundly. Sometimes he passed days without eating at all. He liked to travel at night when it was cool because he thought he would pray better then, too. On one occasion he had supper with the Browns before starting for Florence. Mass was said under great difficulties at times. There were no candles to be procured. Once the people took containers of grease and put strings through them and then lit the ends to replace candles during the Holy Sacrifice.

In 1890 Father Soer was in charge of Lapwai and its missions at Mount Idaho and Grangeville. At that time Grangeville had six Catholic families and services once a year. Nearby Mount Idaho had four families and services three times a year.
