RESIDENT PRAIRIE PASTOR

In 1892, Fr. William Kroeger, a secular priest of Louvain, Belgium, was sent to Keuterville as the first resident pastor on the Prairie, and Grangeville became one of his important missions. All sources agree that a Catholic church was erected on the present site in Grangeville in 1895. Prior to that time, Mass had been said in the Robie home at White Bird as well as the home of Mr. and Mrs. Henry Holz. According to the historical account, "Mr. Nick Lamb worked very hard to get a Catholic Church, going to the mines with Father to collect money. At Warrens Mr. Lamb lost track of Father Kroeger and finally after hours of search found him by the bedside of an old, sick miner with whom he had spent most of the night trying to reconcile the man with his God before death called."

Why does God tolerate so much evil?

Saint Thomas Aquinas says, "God permits evil in order to bring out of it a greater good..." One of Jesus' parables, presented in the Gospel of Mathew, gives us a most helpful and illuminating comparison. The Lord speaks of a farmer who sows a field with good and who finds, to his chagrin, that an enemy has sown weeds among the wheat. When the two crops grow up together, servants of the farmer suggest that the weeds be torn up. The wise planter counsels against this, for in the very act of extracting the weeds, the wheat might be compromised. Better, he says, to let them grow together and be separated only at the harvest....There are evils such as sickness, failure, deep anxieties, and others - that mysteriously play a role in the development of good...
