History of Sts. Peter & Paul Church

A Pastor For Grangeville

... (1892 to 1992 History Booklet)

Father A. M. Billiau became the first resident pastor in July, 1905. From that time, the parish records, which had been kept at Keuterville or Cottonwood, were kept at the Grangeville rectory. Fr. Billiau’s first baptism was on Sept. 24, 1905 and the first marriage on Dec. 27, 1905. Fr. Billiau had Denver for his principal mission. He built an addition to the Grangeville rectory during his first year here. He also recorded a First communion class of seventeen in June 1906. During his administration Grangeville was an extensive parish, for he reports mission stations at Elk City, Dixie, Orogrande, Salmon River, Boles, Joseph, Stites, White Bird, Woodside, Craigmont, Forest, and Winchester.

Like all pioneer priests, the pastor exhibited great zeal and energy in covering his territory on horseback or by buggy. He planted trees, painted and worked like a laborer to improve the property.

Reubens church, until then served as a mission by the Jesuits, was added to Grangeville. Fr. Billiau also died from the results of a trip to Elk City in October, 1907. From Fr. Billiau’s death until July 1908, Father George DeStoop was pastor.

A railroad was already under construction and the first train would make its entrance into Grangeville in December of that year. For the next five years the **Benedictine Fathers from St. Michael’s Monastery** had charge of Grangeville. They were: Fathers Odilo Schieber, 1908-1909; James Mercier, 1901-1912; Jerome Veth, 1912-1913; and Berthold Jaeggli, 1913. Father James Mercier added a bell tower to the church in 1910.

Bishop Glorieux sent Father James Mooney to be resident pastor in November 1913 and he remained until February 1915. During Fr. Mooney’s time, the funeral was recorded of a man who died after being kicked by a horse. There were a number of burials of those who died in the influenza and pneumonia epidemic of World War I. In 1917, a death from tuberculosis was recorded. Fr. Mooney’s successor was Father Remi Zuur until June 1918. Under him the Winchester church was erected in 1916 through donations of Remy Harris and George Kern.
