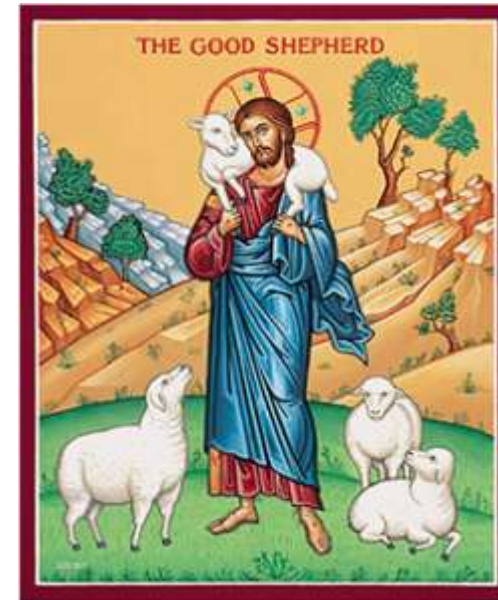

**History of Sts. Peter & Paul Church**

**A Pastor For Grangeville**

... (1892 to 1992 History Booklet) ..... **The 1930's**  
During the pastor ship of Fr. DuPont the buildings were thoroughly repaired and a sanctuary and sacristy added to the church.

The Ku Klux Klan was in power in Grangeville, and only 17 families, “practiced in the faith,” came to church. Within seven years what Fr. DuPont called the “material side” was repaired and spiritual progress was made. The parish had 97 families when Bishop Kelly removed Fr. DuPont to St. Anthony.....

In August 1929 Father J. A. Jentges took over the pastorate of the Church of Sts. Peter and Paul. Father Earl A Stokoe followed him in September 1931. Cornelius Baune, who moved to Grangeville from the Cottonwood parish at this time, recalls Fr. Stokoe's assumption that the 13 year old Cornelius knew how to serve Mass. When Father found that he did not, he came to the Baune's farm and taught Cornelius the Latin responses.

Baune also recalled the potbellied stove that was the church's only source of heat. Since the priest was frequently away serving one of the missions, the first person who arrived at the church for Mass would build a fire in the stove. On several occasions the church was so cold that the water froze in the cruet. Pipes in the rectory frequently froze and leaked, making it necessary to replace them.

The heat was also very uneven, with those near the stove being overheated, and those on the far side of the church, freezing.

Leo Baune, five years younger, was also an altar boy, as were several young members of the Wren family. Leo's principal memory of Fr. DuPont's era was the time when members arrived to find the interior of the church painted dark green.

Art Grabski recalled Fr. DuPont's sense of humor and his great strength; as a child Art saw him carry a full wash tub of water to a tree.

Fr. Bernard McBride was appointed pastor in September of the next year. This was the era when President Roosevelt's “New Deal” was underway. Civilian Conservation Corps (CCC) camps sprang up all through the hills of Idaho. A large number of Catholic young men were working out in the hills behind Grangeville and Father McBride spent many a day in the woods caring for the spiritual needs of these young men.
