We are having a really great time. God has been blessing us tremendously. This morning (Sunday) we celebrated Mass at the shrine of Black Madonna and we were so very close to her. It was so special - a great honor to be there so close to where the heart of Poland beats. I pray for the parishioners at every Mass. So far this has been the highlight of our trip. We also celebrated Mass at the tomb of Blessed Jerzy Popieluszko, the priest martyr. So many graces!

Earlier today we went to Auschwitz. It was very hard for people to visit this horrible place. We prayed outside the cell of St. Maximilian Kolbe who died there. Then we visited Wadowice where St. John Paul II was born and grew up. Everybody wanted to try the famous cake 'kremowki' that JP II liked so much. Only 500 calories but we walked it off! We are in Krakow now for the next four days and then I am going home to see my parents. Anyway - such a spiritual time to visit so many special places. We will keep you in our prayers.

“ Rediscovering Catholicism ”

Let's decide, here and now, today, to begin to explore the genius of our faith, to be part of the solution, and to step it up a notch.

As the centuries have passed, much has changed. Today, Catholicism is the largest faith community on earth. With more than a billion members across the globe, we are no longer the small minority group the first Christians were.
