Pentecost Sunday

(Theme: The Spirit at Work)

We know how difficult it would be to explain the intricacies of a computer or the complexity of ballistics used for space flights to a person without formal education.



For such a person lacks the very concepts that would be needed to understand such things. We face somewhat the same problem when we apply our limited hearts and minds to the contemplation of the infinite God and outpouring of his Spirit. We should therefore realize that all the Bible can do is attempt to say some meaningful things about the Spirit of God in limited human terminology. Human speech cannot possibly express adequately who God is.

The Bible readings for the Day of Pentecost bring out the function of the Holy Spirit. Old Testament images are used which have also inspired New Testament passages on the Spirit. First, the Spirit is seen as a **unifying force**. “It holds all things together” (Wis 1:7:) Hence, the first reading concerns the confusion of speech at Babel, a reversal of the Pentecost narrative where the Spirit unites by overcoming division caused by misunderstanding (different tongues!) This is symbolism, of course, but entirely meaningful.

Secondly, the Spirit is seen as **the principle of love**. Hence, the symbolism of fire is used. In the second reading from Exodus, the Lord came down in fire, as on the disciples at Pentecost. “Come, Holy Spirit,...and kindle in them the fire of your love”. Thirdly, the Spirit is seen as Life-giving, as the “*ruah Yahweh*”—the breath (**spirit**) of the God-Creator hovering over the water (Gn 1:1). Hence, the third reading is the famous passage from Ezekiel where the spirit (**breath**) of the lord reanimates dry bones, which stand for the house of Israel, God's people.

Fourthly, the Spirit is seen as a strong driving wind inspiring people to preach the Gospel. Hence, the fourth reading is from Joel: “I will pour out my spirit (**breath**) upon all mankind. Your sons and daughters shall prophesy,” as the apostles did on Pentecost: “making bold proclamation as the Spirit prompted them.” The point

of all these readings (God's word) is that we should apply this to the Church of today, to ourselves! “Come, Holy Spirit, fill the hearts of your faithful”.
