Happy Valentine's Day To All Saint's Day or What?

St. Valentine was a third-century Christian martyr whose feast day is kept on February 14th. Actually he is one of ten St. Valentines, including a ninth-century pop (and these ten are among about 40,000 recognized saints, of whom only a fraction are commemorated on the calendar!). There are various explanations for the connection between his name and the current "Valentine" practices, none of which have anything to do with his life.

Regarding February 14's "original": he was a priest, possibly a bishop, and a physician from the city of Rome. He was beheaded on the 14th. It could be said that it was because of his love for the Lord and His people that his name has become so commonly associated with the devotion of lovers for beloved, children for parents, and friends for friends.

But wait! There's more: People in medieval times believed that birds paired off on February 14th, and that this was the special day, according to natural law, for love to abound and triumph. What a natural time for young men and women to do the same, or at least to send a love token; hence, "love birds," and "valentines." And finally, not to omit the dependable old Romans: In mid-February, they celebrated a festival called Lupercalia to honor Lupercus, their version of the Greek god Pan. Part of the festivity was for young men to draw names for women dance partners. If enamored ensued, so would engagement-the next mid-February, romantically enough. If this doesn't sound familiar enough, these betrothals were sealed with a gift exchange.

Christianity has often baptized practices as well as people, Valentine's Day being a classic example, at least according to some theories. Pan's passion rites prompted the Church to promote a purity rite instead, memorializing St. Valentine, especially since his feast day was handy by. Part of the plan was to substitute saints' name for women's names. Such piety was no match for passion and romance; all that stuck was "Valentine's Day." Whatever origin you choose, or connection you make, one thing is for sure: Valentines are sent as signs of love, devotion or affection, and they are received as a thoughtful gesture and a nice compliment.

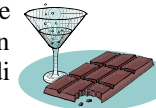
IT'S OPEN FOR YOU!
