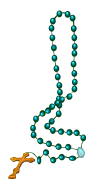

Religious Freedom

(Idaho Catholic Register)

Key points from "Our First, Most Cherished Liberty: A Statement on Religious Liberty" by the U.S. bishops' Ad Hoc Committee for Religious Liberty.

- U.S. Catholics should not have to choose between being Catholics and being Americans.
- Attacks on religious liberty have real-world consequences.
- Religious believers do not give up their rights to participate in civil society.
- Religious liberty requires constant vigilance and protection, or it will disappear.
- Unjust laws—those out of harmony with moral law—cannot be obeyed and no accommodation can be made to an unjust law.
- Christians of various traditions share with Catholics a concern about efforts to strip religious arguments from public debate.
- If religious liberty erodes at home, defense of religious freedom abroad becomes less credible.
- Catholics must pray and fast for religious liberty.
- A special period of prayer, study, catecheses and public action will take place **June 21-July 4**.
- Bishops and priest should preach about religious liberty here and abroad on Nov. 25, feast of Christ the King.

Christ is not jealous...

Q. Several months ago, you recommended having various devotions take place while the Blessed Sacrament is exposed, including the Rosary. I know a priest who says that this is improper, inasmuch as the Rosary is directed to our Lady, thereby ignoring the Eucharistic Christ. Do you still stand by your original statement?

A. Although I have treated this topic once before in these pages, I now have before me a Roman response, which might give more credibility to my original statement. Jesus is not jealous of His Mother; prayers directed to her do not offend Him if He is present. After all, as God, Jesus is present everywhere and at all times; using that logic, one can never speak to any other being, let alone pray to the saints. A recent letter from the Congregation for Divine Worship, however, makes two important points: **1)** Citing Pope Paul VI's *Marialis Cultus* (no. 46), it notes that the Rosary is certainly "Christocentric and renders praise to Our Lord Jesus Christ: **2)** The matter is not one of conflict between two devotions but the need for catechesis to throw into relief the specific characteristics of each devotion and thus enriching the devotional life of the people of God."
