Catechism of the Catholic Church

CCC #2192: “Sunday...is to be observed as the foremost holy day of obligation in the universal Church”
“ On Sundays and other holy days of obligation the faithful are bound to participate in the Mass.”

Many opportunities offered to you to attend Mass. Jesus waits for us.

What does God want most?
This question has already been asked—in the Bible. And the same answer given almost 2,000 years ago is true today. Here is what Saint Mark recorded:

A teacher of the Law was there who heard the discussion. He saw that Jesus had given the Sadducees a good answer, so he came to him with a question: “Which commandment is the most important of all?”

Jesus replied, “The most important one is this: “Listen, Israel! The Lord your God is the only Lord. Love the Lord your God with all your heart, with all your soul, with all your mind, and with all your strength.’ The second most important commandment is this: ‘Love your neighbor as you love yourself.’ There is no other commandment more important than these two.”


The teacher of the Law said to Jesus, “Well done, Teacher! It is true, as you say, that only the Lord is God and that there is no other god but he. And man must love God with all his heart and with all his mind and with all his strength; and he must love his neighbor as he loves himself. It is more important to obey these two commandments than to offer on the altar animals and other sacrifices to God.”

Jesus noticed how wise his answer was, and so he told him, “you are not far from the Kingdom of God” (Mk 12:28-34).

Once we know the answer to the question “What does God want more?” we also know the answer to the question “What is the meaning of life?” That is the most important of all questions. The simple answer to Question One of the old classic Baltimore Catechism summarizes the whole Bible’s answer: “To know Him, to love Him and to serve Him in this world and to be happy with Him in the next.” **That is what God wants most from us.**
