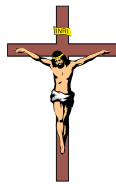

The Assumption of the Blessed Virgin Mary: Mary Is Sent to Heaven and We Are Sent to the World.



On the Feast of the Assumption in the year 1217, Saint Dominic, having just received papal approval for his new Order of Preachers, sent forth his brethren into the world. He had told these earliest Dominican friars that seed which is hoarded rots. Saint Dominic had infinite trust in almighty God to watch over them, and also in the Blessed Virgin Mary, for it was her feast day, and what a fitting one it was for sending forth.

One aspect of the Church’s teaching about Mary’s Assumption into heaven has to do with her not knowing the effects of death in the grave. Her body because of its sinlessness was to be free from corruption. She was taken up to heaven, body and soul.

It is this truth of Mary’s sinlessness that reminds the Church in every age and the preacher in every pulpit of the sheer power of God’s grace. It is this power of God’s grace alone which can open a hardened heart to the Gospel, which can rescue a sinner from his sin, and which can defy even death of its rotting.

Mary did watch over those friars that day, and still the newer friars to this day. Her Assumption remains a herald of the next world to come while we are sent into this one.
