Parents of Babies/Children Needing Baptism ~ Please note!

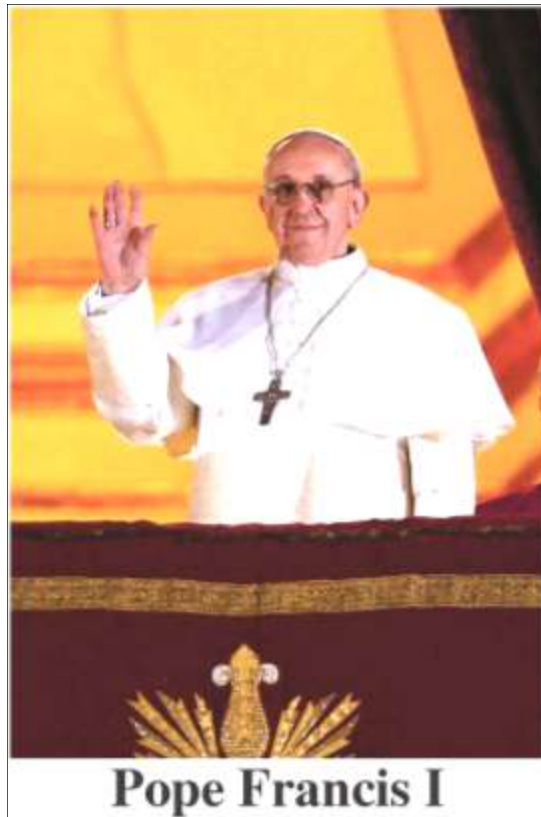
We have been really blessed with many children being born in our community. To simplify the preparation process:
