The Date of Easter

The date of Easter is based on the resurrection of Jesus, three days after his crucifixion which occurred on Passover, the fourteenth of the month of Nisan, according to the Jewish calendar. Much debate and conflict has been spawned by efforts to determine this date annually. The difficulty comes in translating an “immovable feast” from a lunar to the Christian solar calendar (Julian, and now Gregorian), on which it becomes a movable feast. The Council of Nicaea in 325 placed Easter on the first Sunday following the first full moon after March 20 (which is the vernal equinox, when the sun is directly above the earth’s equator). This date allowed pilgrims to have moonlight for traveling to the great Easter festivals of that day. Easter may be as early as March 22 and late as April 25.



Easter Season

Easter Season refers to the Great Fifty Days from Easter Sunday to Pentecost Sunday. A celebration of resurrection from the death of sin to life of grace. The last ten days (Ascension Thursday through Pentecost) focus on the promise of the presence and power of the Holy Spirit. The fiftieth Day (“pente-”) is seven (the perfect number) squared, plus one (the first day of the New Life.). The word probably has roots in the Norse term “Eostur,” the season of the rising sun, or the time of the new birth of Spring. Both these meanings lent themselves well as Christian symbolism for the new life of the Risen Christ, the eternal light.

The Proud Lily

There is much lily lore. It would be enough for it to be a spring flower, representing life’s renewal and the spirit’s rebirth. But there is more. According to legend, the lily lost its self-respect on the night of Christ’s agony in the garden: the other flowers bowed their heads in sorrow in Christ’s presence, but not the lily. How could it, being the most fragrant and beautiful flower in the Garden (according to its own estimation)? Upon Christ’s display of humility, however, the lily belatedly hung its head in shame, and has humbly remained so ever since. (As a matter of fact, our Easter lily is not native to Palestine, but was imported in the 1880s from Bermuda. “Croft’s Lily” is grown mainly in the Pacific Northwest and California.)

Easter Caskets

Eggs....Not only do they symbolize spring’s rebirth, but also Christ’s resurrection, representing his tomb: the hard, cold casket from which new life finally and triumphantly broke forth. The Roman proverb *Omne vivum ex ovo* (“All life comes from an egg”) took on a new, religious significance.

Colored Eggs

According to a Ukrainian folk tale, a poor peddler went to the marketplace to sell a basket of eggs one day. He encountered a crowd mocking a man who staggered as he carried a heavy cross on which he was about to be crucified. Running to his aid, the peddler left the basket by the roadside. Upon his return, he found the eggs wondrously transformed with exquisite designs of bright colors. The man was Christ; the peddler, Simon of Cyrene. And the eggs were to become the symbol of rebirth for all mankind. Even today in the Ukraine, decorating “*psanky*,” as the native eggs are called is a treasured craft and custom.
