A Special Promise of Divine Mercy (from Jesus)

Our Lord's promise to grant complete forgiveness of sins and punishment on the Feast of Mercy is recorded three times in the Diary of Saint Faustina, each time in a slightly different way:

- 1) *"I want to grant a complete pardon to the souls that will go to Confession and receive Holy Communion on the Feast of My mercy" (1109).*
- 2) *"Whoever approaches the Fountain of Life on this day will be granted complete forgiveness of sins and punishment" (300).*
- 3) *"The soul that will go to Confession and receive Holy Communion will obtain complete forgiveness of sins and punishment" (699).*

In His revelations to Saint Faustina **Our Lord makes it very clear what He is offering us in Holy Communion and how much it hurts Him when we treat His presence with indifference:**

"My great delight is to unite Myself with souls ... When I come to a human heart in Holy Communion, My hands are full of all kinds of graces which I want to give to the soul. But souls do not even pay any attention to Me; they leave Me to Myself and busy themselves with other things. Oh, how sad I am that souls do not recognize Love! They treat Me as a dead object!" (1385) ...

Feast of the Annunciation

For over 15 centuries the feast of the Annunciation has been celebrated on March 25, exactly nine months before Christmas.

If March 25 falls during Holy Week, the feast is moved to the first available date after Holy Week and Easter Week—since no feast can take priority over these holy days.

This year March 25 fell on the Monday of Holy Week. So, the Annunciation is celebrated the (8th), the first available day after Holy Week and Easter Week.

When do we bow to the tabernacle?

The issue is reverence: You know it when you see it. An elderly priest would topple over if he tried to genuflect, but you can feel the adoration in his bow, in the inclination of his head, and the prayerful holding of this position for a second or two. And even though the altar stands between him and the tabernacle, he knows the altar is only a symbol of Jesus. As he adores the one real Jesus of his life, he knows the consecrated host in the tabernacle is the reality.

Our bishops have recommended to each of us a bow of the head as our common and shared reverence before we receive the consecrated host or the Precious Blood. But there are bows, and then there are bows. As you receive Holy Communion, follow that elderly priest's lead: Try not to hurry it. Reverence, which is a sublime courtesy, is also a matter of feeling and atmosphere that can fill the church just as really as the fragrance of incense.
