St. Michael ~ Archangel

St. Michael is viewed as one of the chief leaders against the forces of Heaven in their triumph over the powers of hell. St. Michael's feast day is celebrated on September 29. He is the patron saint of many causes and beloved by all. These causes include: temptation, artists, firefighters, police officers, soldiers, grocers, mariners, and sickness. St. Michael has strength and power and courage and is a loving saint. God gave us St. Michael to emulate and to remain in the spiritual battle.

Saint Anserus and Companions ~ Martyrs (+1066)

A native of Schleswig, Germany, Anserus, abbot of a monastery near Ratzeburg, preached the Gospel to the Obotrite people of northern Germany, who were pagan nature worshippers. A scholar named Oswald was attending a Mass celebrated by Anserus when he saw in a vision the Apostle Saint John standing beside Anserus at the altar to assist him in elevating the Eucharist. Most likely the elevation referred to here is the raising of the host and chalice that takes place at the end of the Eucharistic Prayer (at the words, "Through him, and with him", etc.). This vision would later be understood as symbolic of the spiritual victory that Anserus was to gain by his martyrdom. It was likened to the elevation of Moses' hands in prayer that obtained victory for the Israelites in their battle with Amalek (Ex 17:8-13). On another occasion, while Anserus was lying prostrate before the altar, offering his thanksgiving after Mass, Oswald saw in a vision the Christ child placing his hands upon Anserus' head. On July 15, 1066, Anserus, twenty-eight fellow monks, and many other Catholics were stoned to death by the pagans.
