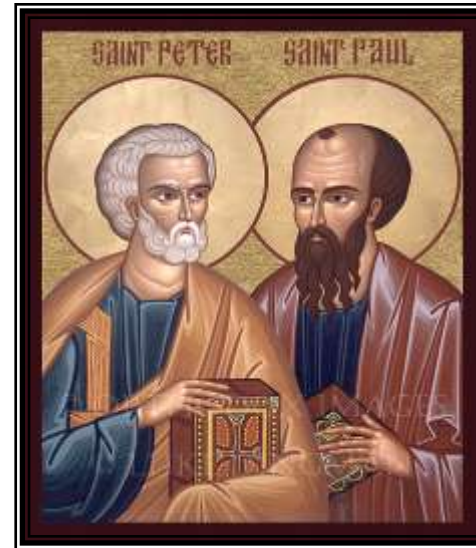

The Five First Saturdays

Devotion to the Immaculate Heart of Mary on the first Saturdays of five successive months originated in the revelations of Mary at Fatima. Mary told three shepherd children through a series of six apparitions (May 13-Oct 13, 1917) that she desired frequent recitation of the Rosary and penance done for sinners. She predicted WW II, the rise of communism and Church persecution. She promised the conversion of Russia and peace for mankind if her wishes were followed.

She requested the faithful to **make reparation for blasphemies, ingratitude to her Son, and sin and for peace in the world.** 1) go to Confession at least 8 days before or up to 8 days after the First Saturday, 2) Receive Communion, 3) Recite 5 decades of the Rosary, 4) Meditate 15 minutes on the mysteries.

Father Mariusz has been making this special devotion available to everyone, with celebrating a **7AM First Saturday Mass** in honor of our Blessed Mother—each First Saturday of the month. We are privileged to have this special Mass available. All are welcome and encouraged to attend.

Our Blessed Mother takes us on a tour of Our Lord’s life in the Rosary.
