The Assumption of Blessed Virgin Mary

Pope Pius XII proclaimed the Assumption of the Blessed Virgin Mary, a doctrine of the Faith on November 1, 1950. This dogma states the Assumption of Mary was taken up body and soul into heaven after the completion of her earthly life (or falling asleep in the Lord), since by reason of her Immaculate Conception she should not suffer the consequences of original sin.

St. Francis de Sales suggests, that the Assumption is necessitated by the desire of the Trinity to behold for eternity Mary, who enjoys a unique relationship with each Person of the Trinity: Father-daughter, Holy Spirit-bride, Son-mother.

The feast of the Assumption was celebrated by Christians as early as the seventh century.

HOLY SLEEPING

The Basilicas of the Dormition (“sleeping”) on Mt. Zion, and the Church of the Tomb, near Gethsemani, are two beloved Marian shrines in the Holy Land. The Scriptures record that Jesus gave his mother into John’s keeping, and tradition has it that he took her to Ephesus; at her death, the apostles helped John in preparing her tomb—a temporary place for all of us, but more so for her as things happened. Today, after crossing the Kidron Brook at the foot of Mt. Olivet, the Church of the Tomb is the first monument one finds. Shared since 1757 by Greeks, Armenians, Syrians, Copts, and Abyssinians, it is venerated as a holy place also by Moslems, who have long honored Mary.
