St. Maria Faustina Kowalska was an unknown girl from a poor Polish family. She had a total of only 3 years basic education, but from the tender age of seven she had a deep yearning for a religious vocation. When she first presented herself to the Congregation of the Sisters of Our Lady of Mercy, she was told that she had to go find a job in order to pay for her habit. Her entry to the convent was documented in July 1924, when the Mother General reported that she was "no one special".

"To all external appearances nothing betrayed her extraordinarily rich mystical life. She zealously went about her duties, she faithfully observed all the religious rules, she was recollected and kept silent, all the while being natural, cheerful, full of kindness and of unselfish love of neighbor." It was to this "unremarkable" and simply educated young woman that Jesus appeared. During the last four years of her life He ordered her to write a diary, and entrusted to her His message of Divine Mercy. She was to become the "Apostle of Divine Mercy" to the entire world. Now, the Church recognizes Sister Maria Faustina Kowalska not only as a saint, but as one of the most outstanding mystics in the history of the Catholic Church.

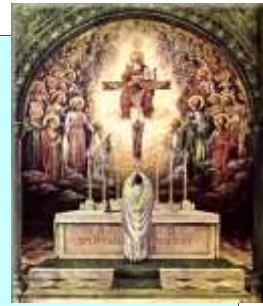

Please remember some fundamental principles upon which our behavior and attitudes in church rest:



1. **DRESS APPROPRIATELY.** One should always wear clothes that are modest, and, if at all possible, all things being equal, clean and the nicest clothes one has. Shorts, sweats, halter tops, low cut blouses, tee shirts, and the like are a distraction and diminish the reverential aspect of the Mass.
2. **BE ON TIME.** It is extremely distracting when people arrive late to Mass. One should do everything in one's power to arrive on time – better yet, early, so as to avoid disturbing one's fellow worshippers and their focus on the Mass.
3. **TURN CELL PHONES AND PAGERS OFF.** The reasons for this should be obvious.
4. **THINK OF THE CHURCH, ALWAYS AND AT ALL TIMES, AS SACRED SPACE AND A SACRED PLACE.** The church is first, and foremost, a place of worship. It is not an auditorium, convention center, or meeting hall. The church is the primary place we come to spend time with and be intimate with GOD.
