History of Sts. Peter & Paul Church
A Resident Prairie Pastor

... (1892 to 1992 History Booklet)

A subscription list was passed early in that year by Pat Toal of Mount Idaho and eight families were named as subscribers: those of Henry Holz (or Holtz), Henry I. Murray, Franklin Hogan, A.J. Fassnacht, Frank McGrance, John Oliver, (_____) Collins, and Patrick Toal.

Lots in the Lewiston Addition of Grangeville were deeded to the Most Reverend A. J. Glorieux on May 16, 1895, by W. W. Brown, a local banker, and his wife, for the consideration of fifty dollars. The deed was recorded Nov. 26, 1895. (The Browns were the parents of Mrs. Dale (Zelma) Eimers.)

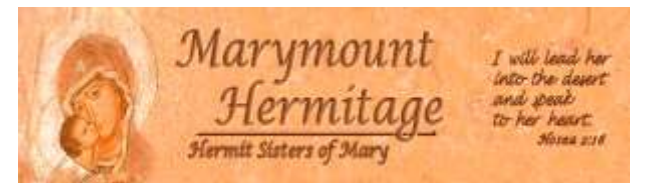
Lumber for the church was hauled during June of 1895 from Forsmann's mill near Keuterville, and a contract for the building was awarded to William H. Campbell and Frank Vansise, both carpenters. The dimensions of the church were 24 by 40 feet by 16 feet in height. There were no other buildings located in the immediate area.

The first Mss was offered in the church at 9:30am on Wednesday, January 29, 1896. Immediately following the service there was instruction in Catechism. According to the notice in the Idaho County Free Press, "Tuesday evening, January 28, and Wednesday morning, January 29, from 6 till 9:30 the faithful will have an opportunity to receive the Sacraments."

These services continued until the death of Father Kroeger, "from the results of a sick call to Elk City," in 1897, according to the records.

Salvatorian fathers from Keuterville and Cottonwood, particularly Fr. Louis Mueller and Fr. Maximus Parolini, served the parish until 1902.

In 1903 the parish erected a small parish house for the convenience of the priest. Grangeville was attended in this period by Benedictines from Cottonwood, Fathers Berthold Jaeggle and Odilo Schieber.
