“Memorial Day” –not in May, as it is in America, but on November 1st, and prolonged through the month, the time in the natural cycle for harvest and dying. We used to call it “the month of the poor souls,” but many today rather say “the month of all saints, “ or holy souls or “Memorial Month.” Actually the Catholic’s “Memorial Day” is plural, including “All Souls” Day, November 2. We distinguish between our loved ones in heaven, “all saints,” who pray for us, and our loved ones who have died, for whom we are moved to pray, the poor souls who still may be undergoing the purging process of death-to-self that follows repentance. In this month of harvest and dying, the Church memorializes the dead and recognizes Jesus as Lord of the living and the dead. Memorial Month.
