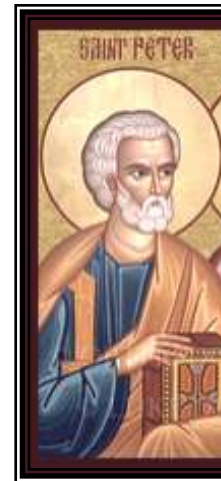

No Pope Peter

The tradition of popes changing names upon election traditionally dates from Sergius IV (1009-1012). The story retold is that his name was Peter di Porca, and he changed it, deferring to St. Peter, considering it unseemly to style himself Peter II. Actually, prior to this, some popes had changed their names to drop a name of pagan origin. The tradition allows pon-

tiffs to show esteem for a predecessor, signal a goal or style they want to have, and demonstrate a total commitment to the office.
