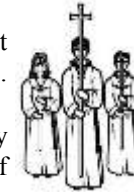

### Ordinary Time

**Q.** Why are most Sundays of the year called "Ordinary" Sundays? Surely Sunday should be special and extraordinary.

**A.** The Sundays of Advent/ Christmas and Lent/Easter celebrate particular aspects or dimensions of the mysteries of faith. The other Sundays of the year do not. They celebrate rather the whole mystery faith. These are called Ordinary, not in the sense of being unimportant or less significant, but in the sense of being normative or standard (by comparison to which the Advent/Christmas and Lent/Easter Sundays are extraordinary).

The Constitution on the Sacred Liturgy of Vatican II spoke of Sunday as "the original feast day" and "the foundation and kernel of the whole liturgical year" (no. 106). Ordinary Sundays are properly regarded as the norm on which everything else in the liturgical year is built. Ordinary Time maybe taken to mean Standard Liturgical Time.
