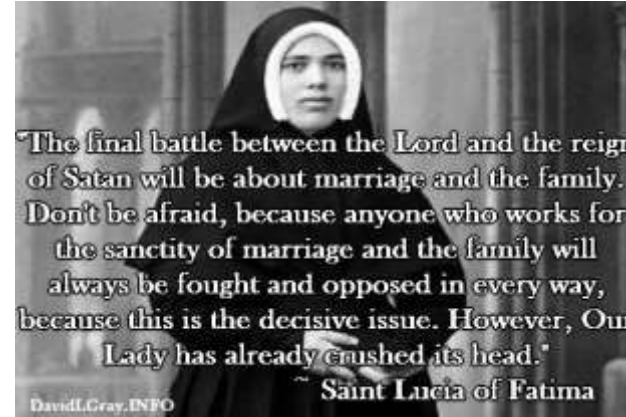

**Why Do Catholic Churches Have Statues and Stained Glass Windows?** In the early years of Christianity, most people were illiterate. Therefore, the Catholic Church often used visual aids such as statues, the stations of the cross (pictures showing the story of Jesus's crucifixion), and stained glass windows to help teach the people the story of Jesus since they could not read their Bibles (which they didn't have) for themselves. Today, the statues simply remind Catholics of the Bible story and inspire them to remember the saints who have gone before. Catholics do not worship these statues.

#### Habits for the Catholic Family

- 1. Pray together as a family every day.** Try the Rosary and the Divine Mercy Chaplet. Definitely get into the habit of praying a Morning offering.
- 2. Use Catholic media.** Read a saint book with your kids. Look up what the Pope is up to. Where is he what is he doing in the coming month? Pray for him.
- 3. Have an ongoing family charity effort.** Set up a piggy bank to which the entire family contributes each week: for vocations, the hungry, or whatever cause is close to your family. Volunteer!
- 4. Get sacred art into your home.** Beauty draws our souls toward God. Use Catholic paintings, music, and statues to add richness to your family's days and devotions.
- 5. Celebrate Your Saints Day!** “We become what we celebrate”- Mathew Kelly. Remember your Baptism day, 1st Communion, Holy days, Get a Liturgical Calendar and celebrate the saints.
- 6. Go to Confession.** It's the washing machine for the soul, and there is no better feeling than walking out of the confessional, absolved and clean.
- 7. Attend Mass as a family** Every Sunday and Holy Days of Obligation. This is the Greatest gift God has given the Church, and to each of us.
