IDAHO CATHOLIC REGISTER ANNUAL DRIVE October 24-25 ` This Weekend!



THIS WEEKEND is the annual **Idaho Catholic Register Drive** in our diocese. Envelopes are on the back vestibule table. Our new **Bishop Peter Christensen** encourages all our families to subscribe. The Register is improving. Make checks out to our parish as we send one check to Boise. The cost is \$17 per year for 22 issues, less than the cost of a pizza. The drive is through a month's timetable.

Finish 10 Minutes Before Mass

Before our weekend Masses, Father asks that the **devotions during Holy Hour be completed 10 minutes before Mass starts.** This will enable the faithful to prepare and meditate for the awesome coming of our Lord Jesus to us in the Holy Eucharist within the Mass and prepare for His coming.

November 2nd ~ All Souls' Day

On Monday evening, November 2nd...All Souls' Day, parishioners are encouraged to bring pictures of deceased family members and place them in front of the altar. There will also be a board with small cards available on which people may write the names of deceased loved ones. Before Mass the board will be brought to the front of the altar. A special Monday Mass will be at 6:30pm to honor All Souls' Day.



All Souls Day is a solemn celebration in the Roman Catholic Church commemorating all of those who have died and now are in Purgatory, being cleansed of their venial sins and the temporal punishments for the mortal sins that they had confessed and atoning before entering fully into Heaven.

All Souls Day was made clear by Pope Benedict XV (1914-22), when he granted all priests the privilege of celebrating three Masses on All Souls Day: one for the faithful departed; one for the priest's intentions; and one for the intentions of the Holy Father. Only on a handful of other very important feast days are priests allowed to celebrate more than two Masses.

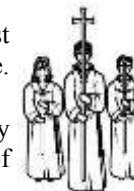
