"Right to Choose" Choose What?

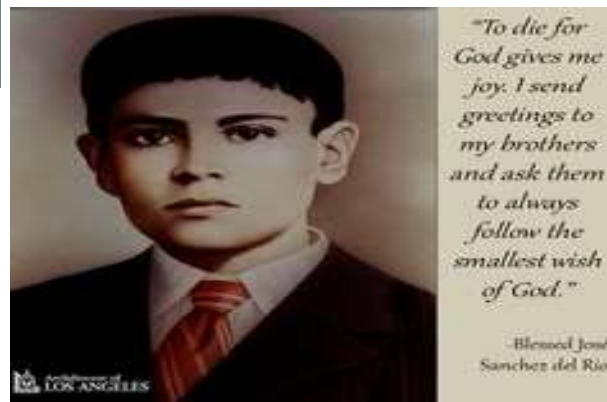

Jose Sanchez del Rio canonized this Sunday Oct. 16, 2016
 The Cristero war in Mexico during the 1920 is a very good thing to study. Here a Progressive / socialist government waged war on Christianity. Eventually the people rebelled. They did not fight for "religious liberty" they fought to return the country to Christianity. Blessed Jose Sanchez del Rio was captured and tortured before being killed by firing squad. The soldiers said: "If you shout, 'Death to Christ the King', we will spare your life." He only answered: "Long live Christ the King! Long live Our Lady of Guadalupe!" Blessed Jose is an outstanding example of faith and courage for all Catholic young men — for you— who wish to be faithful to Christ. He was declared a martyr and was beatified by Pope Benedict XVI on November 20, 2005.



A pilot program for Catechesis of the Good Shepherd, for 3 - 6 year olds, will begin in our parish the week of October 23rd.
