**"Basics of the Catholic Faith"
 Eleventh Class– The Church Years**

Pope Pius XI instituted The Feast of Christ the King in 1925 for the universal church in his encyclical *Quas Primas*. He connected the increasing denial of Christ as king to the rise of secularism throughout Europe. At the time of *Quas Primas*, many Christians (including Catholics) began to doubt Christ's authority and existence, as well as the Church's power to continue Christ's authority. Pope Pius hoped the institution of the feast would have various effects. They were:
 1. That nations would see that the Church has the right to freedom, and immunity from the state (*Quas Primas*, 32).
 2. That leaders and nations would see that they are bound to give respect to Christ (*Quas Primas*, 31).
 3. That the faithful would gain strength and courage from the celebration of the feast, as we are reminded that Christ must reign in our hearts, minds, wills, and bodies (*Quas Primas*, 33).

Sad News About Someone Else

The parish was saddened to learn this week of the death of one of its members, “Someone Else.” Someone’s passing creates a vacancy that will be difficult for us to fill. Else has been with us for many years. Someone did far more than a normal person’s share of the work.
